Online admissions

Parents and carers who live in the Essex County Council area (excluding those living in the Borough of Southend-on-Sea or in Thurrock) can apply for their child's school place online using the Essex Online Admissions Service at: Please ensure that you read the information in this directory alongside the 'Primary Education in Essex 2025/2026' admissions guide, which provides all the information you need to know on the admissions processes.

The online application system has a number of benefits for parents and carers:

- you can access related information through links on the website to find out more about individual schools, such as home to school transport or inspection reports;
- when you have submitted your application you will receive an email confirming this;
- you will be told the outcome of your online application by email on offer day if you requested this when you applied.

You will be able to make your application online from **04 November 2024.**

The closing date for primary applications is **15 January 2025.** This is the statutory national closing date set by the Government.

Key Points to Remember

- APPLY ON TIME closing date 15 January 2025.
- Use all 4 preferences.
- Tell us immediately in writing (email or by letter) about any address change.
- If entitlement to school transport is important to you, please make sure your read and understand the 'Home to School Transport' section in the 'Primary Education in Essex 2025/2026' admissions guide and also the Education Transport policy at www.essex.gov.uk/ schooltransport. School priority admission (catchment) areas are not relevant to transport eligibility. Transport is generally only provided to the nearest available school where the distance criteria is met. It is vital you carefully consider the transport implications before you make your application for a school place. If you need any further advice please contact us at educationawards@essex.gov.uk.

Co-ordinated admission arrangements and what they mean

The law requires a LA to co-ordinate admissions to all primary schools (except independent (fee-paying) or special schools) in their area. Primary schools includes infant schools.

Essex parents must apply for primary school places by completing the Common Application Form. This can either be completed online at **www.essex.gov.uk/admissions**, or you can use a paper application form. **Please do not do both.** Parents can express preferences for up to four schools both in and out of Essex, in the order in which they would like them considered.

On 16 April 2025, parents will be sent one offer of a place at the highest preference school that can be met. If none of the preferences can be met a place will be offered at the nearest Essex school to the child's home address with a space available. Here are some examples of this process:

Example 1 – Parent has applied for four schools and the first preference can be met:

Preference 1 - Offered

Preference 2 – Not offered – right to appeal given*

Preference 3 - Not offered - right to appeal given*

Preference 4 – Not offered – right to appeal given*

Example 2 – Parent has applied for four schools and the second preference can be met:

Preference 1 – Not offered – on waiting list and right to appeal given

Preference 2 - Offered

Preference 3 - Not offered - right to appeal given*

Preference 4 - Not offered - right to appeal given*

Example 3 – Parent has applied to four schools and no preference can be met:

Preference 1 – Not offered – on waiting list and right to appeal given

Preference 2 – Not offered – on waiting list and right to appeal given

Preference 3 – Not offered – on waiting list and right to appeal given

Preference 4 – Not offered – on waiting list and right to appeal given

Child will then be offered a place at the nearest Essex school to the home address with a space available.

* You will note from examples 1 and 2 that children are only held on waiting lists for preferences higher than the one that can be met.

On 16 April 2025 (National offer day) Essex resident families will be sent a notification of the school offer being made. This will either be an email (for those that applied online) or a letter for all other applications.

The Published Admission Number (PAN) is the number of places that the school has available for the new Reception intake In 2025. In general this will be the same as the PAN for 2024. The total number of applications received was collated on 16 April 2024. The PAN and the number of applications received for 2024 should give you an idea of the demand for places at the school. Treat this information carefully and talk to the school about it. For instance, some applications may have been second, third or fourth preferences and these increase the overall number of applications. However you should be aware that if you only apply for schools that are oversubscribed you may not receive a place at any of them.

Note 2

Timing of Admission. As required by law with effect from September 2011, all infant and primary schools provide for the full-time admission of all children offered a place in the reception year group from the September following their fourth birthday. This means that you have the right to a full time place at the school your child is offered from September 2025. Parents can request that the date their child is admitted to school is deferred until later in the school year or until the child reaches compulsory school age in the school year. Where entry is deferred, the school will hold the place for that child and not offer it to another child. The parent would not however be able to defer entry beyond the beginning of the term after the child's fifth birthday, nor beyond the academic year for which the original application was accepted. Parents can also request that their child attends part-time until the child reaches compulsory school age. You would need to check with the individual school(s) what the part-time provision would be. Where parents choose to defer entry, the school may reasonably expect that the child would start at the beginning of a new school term/half term.

In the event there being more applicants than places, the Governors will have regard to the following criteria in this priority order:

- Looked After Children and previously looked after children (as defined in the Primary Education in Essex 2025/2026 booklet);
- 2. children whose home address* is in the parishes of Birch, Great & Little Wigborough, Layer Marney, Layer Breton and Salcott-cum-Virley;
- children who have a brother, sister, stepbrother or stepsister living in the same family unit in the same family household and address, who attends the school in any year group excluding the final year;
- 4. children whose parents are involved** in the life of the Christian Church, of any denomination, for whom this is the nearest church school (reference may be made to their own priest or minister);
- 5. children whose parents, although worshipping in another faith, wish to attend a Christian school because of its specifically religious emphasis;
- 6. children who have medical, pastoral or social reasons for attending this school, which can be supported by professional evidence;
- 7. all other applications.

In each individual oversubscription criterion, priority will be determined by distance. Straight line distances are calculated by the LA as described in the Primary Education in Essex 2025/2026 booklet.

*Home address - Applications will be processed on the basis of the home address or listed allocated address (as informed by Essex County Admissions) for the child at the time of application and determination, unless, where there is a new home address, proof of an exchange of contracts or copy of a tenancy agreement can be provided. The home address is considered to be the address at which the child resides on a permanent basis or is 'ordinarily resident'. This is generally the address of the parent/carer. In some cases, children may be 'ordinarily resident' for the majority of the school week, including overnight, with another relative or carer, such as a grandparent. Where this is the case, the application may be processed on the basis of that address and proof of address and residence arrangement will be required with the application. The child must be living with the relative or carer 24 hours per day, for the majority of the school week. Arrangements where parents can leave and collect children from another relative or carer on a daily basis will be regarded as childcare arrangements, and the child will not be deemed to be 'ordinarily resident' with that person. In all cases we expect that the adult with whom the child is 'ordinarily resident' receives the child benefit for the child (where eligible).

- ** 'Involved' means attending worship on a minimum of 8 occasions annually for at least 2 years prior to the application.

In the event of oversubscription any remaining places will be allocated using the following criteria in the order given:

- 1. Looked After Children and previously looked after children (as defined in the Primary Education in Essex 2025/2026 booklet) including those who have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted;
- 2. children with a sibling[‡] attending the academy or attending Oakwood Infant and Nursery School who will still be on roll at the date of admission;
- 3. children who reside within the priority admission area;
- 4. children who attend Oakwood Infant and Nursery School:
- 5. children of staff; where a member of staff has been employed for two or more years at the time of the application and / or a member of staff is recruited to fill a vacancy for which there is a demonstrable skills shortage (This should be clearly stated on the application form);
- 6. any other applicants.

Within each of the above criteria, proximity of the home to the Academy will be taken into consideration, with those living nearer being accorded the higher priority. (Straight-line distance between home and school will be used as a tie breaker with those living closest to the school having highest priority.)

- Looked After Children and previously looked after children (as defined in the Primary Education in Essex 2025/2026 booklet);
- 2. Children with one or more siblings in the School;
- Children of School staff fulfilling a skills shortage role*;
- 4. Other children, with priority for admission given to those whose home address is the shortest distance from the School. Children in this criteria will be ranked in order of distance.

Tie Breaker

Random allocation will be used as a tie-break in category '4' above to decide who has highest priority for admission if the distance between two children's homes and the School is the same. This process will be independently verified. If a tie-break is required in earlier categories to decide who has priority for admission between two children, distance from the school will be used to decide.

Where multiple birth siblings (twins and triplets etc.) from the same family are tied for the final place, we will admit them all, as permitted by the infant class size rules and exceed our PAN.

'Home address' is defined as "the address at which the child resides on a permanent basis or is 'ordinarily resident'. This is the address of the parent/carer; in some cases, children may be 'ordinarily resident' for the majority of the school

week, including overnight, with another relative or carer, such as a grandparent. This may also be the case where a child resides between two parents at different addresses following the breakdown of the parental relationship. Where this is the case, the application may be processed on the basis of that address and proof of address and residence arrangement will be required with the application. The child must be living with the parent, relative or carer for the majority of the school week. Arrangements where parents can leave and collect children from another relative or carer on a daily basis will be regarded as childcare arrangements, and the child will not be deemed to be 'ordinarily resident' with that person. In all cases we expect that the adult with whom the child is 'ordinarily resident' receives the child benefit for the child (where eligible)".

The exceptions to this rule are the children of UK Armed Forces service personnel with a confirmed posting to their area, or Crown Servants returning from overseas to live in the area, for whom an application for admission may be made in advance of their move where it is accompanied by an official letter that confirms the intended relocation date and a Unit postal address or quartering area address for the child.

* Staff - whether teaching or non-teaching, with a permanent contract to work predominantly at the School (not Trust employees in the REAch2 cluster or central teams). The application of this criterion will be subject to confirmation by an independent Trust non-executive that, on the evidence available, the member of staff has been recruited to fill a post where there is a demonstrable skills shortage. Staff must contact the School Headteacher when applying for a place under this criterion. For the purposes of this criterion, 'children of School staff' is taken to include a son, daughter or step-son/daughter, or child who is adopted or fostered or for whom a special guardianship order is in place, in all cases providing they are living at the same address as the parent who is employed at the School.

'Siblings' - For applications made in the normal admission round a sibling means a brother or sister, legally adopted brother or sister, stepbrother or stepsister, foster brother or sister, or the child of a parent's co-habiting partner; living in the same family unit in the same family household and address who

attends the School at the date of application in any year group excluding the final year. Biological and legally adopted siblings who attend the preferred school in any year group excluding the final year will also be treated as siblings irrespective of place of residence. Children residing in the same household as part of an extended family, such as cousins, will not be treated as siblings.

Straight line distances are calculated by the LA as described in the Primary Education in Essex 2025/2026 booklet.

Children at the School's Nursery

Parents should note that children who attend the School's nursery will not automatically transfer to Reception Year at the School. An application for admission to Reception Year must be made in the normal way.

• Children will be regarded as having been in state care outside England if they were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation or any other provider of care whose sole purpose is to benefit society. Applicants under this criterion will also need to fill in a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) evidencing state care outside of England. The SIF is available from the school website or school office.

- 2. children with a sibling# attending the school;
- 3. children living in the priority admission area*;
- 4. remaining applications.

In the event of oversubscription within any of the above criteria, priority will be determined by straight line distance from home to school, those living closest being given the highest priority.

Applications will normally be processed on the basis of the home address for the child at the time of applications, with an expectation that the child will still reside there at the time of admission. Where there is a new home address, proof of an exchange of contracts or copy of a tenancy agreement should be provided. The home address is considered to be the address at which the child resides on a permanent basis or is 'ordinarily resident'. This is generally the address of the parent. The child must be living with the parent or carer 24 hours per day, for the majority of the school week. Arrangements where parents can leave and collect children from a relative or a carer on a daily basis will be regarded as childcare arrangements, and the child will not be deemed to be 'ordinarily resident' with that person. In all cases

we expect that the adult with whom the child is 'ordinarily resident' receives the child benefit for the child.

The school will ask applicants to provide proof of their home address. This will include a copy of the following:

- Council tax notification
- Two utility bills dated within the last 6 months (gas, electricity, water or landline phone).

The school reserves the right to take additional checking measures including further documentation and in some cases unannounced home visits.

If a school place is secured through false information regarding a home address, the school may withdraw the place offered.


