Autism Central for Parents and Carers

The East of England Autism Central Hubs offer guidance to families, carers, and personal assistants of autistic people of any age. They do not need a diagnosis to access the service. Support is provided by parents and carers of autistic people who are happy to share their knowledge and experience with others. What they can offer:

- A constantly growing range of information and resources.
- Weekly online groups drop ins and themed sessions covering a range of topics.
- 1:1 support via a telephone or Teams call.

Essex Family Forum

We are the parent carer forum in Essex for families whose children and young people, up to the age of 25, have special educational needs or disabilities.

What does Essex Family Forum as a Parent Carer Forum do?

We work with (not for) local authorities, health commissioning bodies and social care to represent parent views and experiences to influence and inform the provision and services used by our children, young people, and their families.

Essex Family Forum believes in co-production. Co-production is when parent carers play an integral and equal part in the decision-making process and are fully engaged in shaping, developing, implementing, and evaluating services and systems.

ACL (Adult Community Learning) Community and Family Wellbeing Hub

Offer FREE interactive courses to help you negotiate these tricky times. If you are a parent, grandparent or caring for a child or young person living in Essex they have support for you.

Courses are delivered online live & face to face at various locations across Essex and some flexible learning classes. You will come to non-judgemental, supportive learning sessions facilitated to support your family's journey.

Virtual School

The Essex Virtual School is dedicated to supporting children in care (CiC), previously looked-after children (PLAC), and those under Special Guardianship Orders, helping them to thrive as learners.

They aim to enhance educational outcomes by providing guidance and support that raises aspirations and expectations for these children and young people.

They work with designated teachers, social workers, carers and other partners at times of difficulty and need.

Their aim is to:

- improve understanding of the unique barriers to learning and education experienced by many of our children and young people
- •promote and foster a culture that takes account of children and young people's views according to age and understanding, identifying, and meeting their educational needs
- •work in partnership with all of those who support our children and young people to raise aspirations and expectations and build capacity to make a positive difference to their educational experiences and outcomes
- •provide support and challenge where needed to ensure that the educational needs of our children are prioritised
